National Diabetes Statistics Report, 2014

Total: 29.1 million people or 9.3% of the US population have diabetes.

Diagnosed: 21.0 million people

Undiagnosed: 8.1 million people

Pre-diabetes: 86 million people

New Cases: 1.7 million new cases of diabetes are diagnosed in people aged 20 years and older each year.

Deaths: Diabetes was the seventh leading cause of death listed on U.S. death certificates in 2010. This ranking is based on the 69,071 death certificates in 2010 in which diabetes was listed as the underlying cause of death.

Co-existing conditions and complications among people with diagnosed diabetes:

- Hypoglycemia and hyperglycemia Crisis
- High blood pressure
- Heart disease and stroke
- Blindness
- Kidney disease
- Amputation

Total costs: Diagnosed diabetes (both direct and indirect) in the United States in 2012 was estimated to cost \$254 billion.

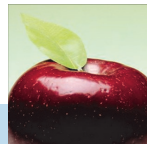

The Sidney Regional Medical Center's Diabetes Education Program offers you the educational resources, to help you successfully manage your diabetes and reduce the risk of complications. Our certified diabetes educators provide an extensive range of individuals and group education..

The program covers:

- Patient assessment (prior knowledge/perception of diabetes)
- Glucose monitoring
- Medications and their effectiveness
- Nutritional management
- Importance of physical activity in controlling blood sugars and weight management
- Managing sick days and diabetes
- Acute complications (hypoglycemia and hyperglycemia)
- Long term complications of diabetes, how to minimize or prevent
- Setting behavioral goals (for nutrition, physical activity or weight management)

Take Control of Your Diabetes

Learning as much as you can about nutrition, exercise, medication and monitoring is a critical part of taking control of your diabetes. Our diabetes educators work together with you and your doctor to create an individualized comprehensive education program.

To Registration

Participation in this program requires a referral. Before you register for a appointment you'll need to:

- Ask your physician to send us a referral form
- Check with your insurance provider about diabetes education coverage; be sure to tell them it's billed through SRMC

Your Diabetes Education Appointments

You will meet individually with a nurse and a nutrition educator or attend group classes taught by our diabetes educators and a pharmacist. We encourage you to bring along your spouse, relative or friend for support. We'll communicate with your physician after your appointment to start a diabetes self management plan for you.
