



## **Are you confused about getting your 3rd dose or booster Covid Vaccination?**

### **Let SRMC help clarify....**

If you are moderately to severely immunocompromised (diabetic, cancer patient, chronic illnesses) you are eligible to receive a 3rd dose of either Moderna or Pfizer no matter the age.

- The 3rd dose is to be administered 28 days after the 2nd dose.
- You cannot 'switch' vaccine types, meaning if you received Moderna for your first and second dose, you cannot get the Pfizer vaccine for the booster or 3rd dose.

If you are 65+, live in a congregate setting, are age 50-64 and at high risk for severe disease, age 18-49 and at high risk for severe disease or work in a high risk occupational exposure career (including frontline workers: teachers, healthcare, packing plant) you are eligible to receive a Booster of Pfizer ONLY.

- The booster is to be administered 6 months after the 2nd dose.
- You cannot 'switch' vaccine types, meaning if you received Moderna for your first and second dose, you cannot get the Pfizer vaccine for the booster or 3rd dose.

### **Important key points:**

- Definition of "fully vaccinated" is still just 2 doses if you received Moderna and Pfizer, and one dose if Johnson and Johnson.
- They have NOT released a booster for Moderna at this time. We expect an update in the coming weeks regarding this.
- The difference between a 3rd dose and booster is the 3rd dose is for immune compromised patients and administered 28 days after second dose of Pfizer and Moderna. The booster is for Pfizer only and you must fall into one of the categories identified above and is administered 6 months after the 2nd dose.
- If you have lost your vaccination card, SRMC will be able to verify your dates and type of your first and second doses and provide a new vaccination card for you. If you want a full print of your or your child's vaccination registration you can obtain this by providing your date of birth and social security number at [dhhs.ne.gov/nesiis](https://dhhs.ne.gov/nesiis).
- If you received dose 1 or 2 of Moderna or Pfizer at another location, you can schedule at SRMC for your 3rd or booster vaccination.

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### **How can you schedule?**

- Call 308-254-5544 to schedule either your first, second, third or booster dose of both Pfizer and Moderna. These will be scheduled on the RHC Physician's Clinic Nurse Visit Schedule.
- Register and Sign Up through [www.pphd.org](http://www.pphd.org)
- Walk In appointments are not accepted at this time.
- There will be no mass vaccination clinics offered at SRMC at this time.

***If you are unsure if you qualify for immunocompromised or the Pfizer booster, you should discuss in more detail with your provider.***

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
